



Nine-year program created to help socially and economically disadvantaged entrepreneurs gain access to—and succeed in—the federal marketplace

Build capacity and grow through contracts

Access to business development support

Program Purpose

- 8(a) certification is a path to new business growth.
- The 8(a) BD Program diversifies small businesses' revenue streams with federal contracting dollars. Qualified 8(a) businesses can create new business paths and jobs through increased revenues from government contracting.
- Through the 8(a) BD Program, the SBA provides small disadvantaged businesses with exclusive access to reserved federal contracting opportunities and a unique opportunity for direct contract awards.



When Should You Apply?

Are You Ready?

- Do you have the **<u>CAPACITY</u>** to deliver on federal contracts?
- Do you have sufficient **CASH FLOW**?
- Do you have demonstrated **<u>CAPABILITY</u>** (past performance)?
- Can you demonstrate successful **PAST PERFORMANCE**?
- Are you open to **ADVICE** on growing your business?

How to Apply?

- <u>Get local assistance</u> and find out if you are ready to apply by meeting with an SBA BOS or APEX Accelerator counselors (formerly Procurement Technical Assistance Center)
- Identify your primary <u>NAICS code(s)</u>
- Register your business in the <u>System for Award Management</u> (SAM)
- Make sure to apply for 8(a) certification at <u>certify.sba.gov</u>. Before you start, visit the Knowledge Base on the Certify website where you can find helpful resources including the application guide to assist with gathering necessary documentation, as well as completing and submitting your application
