- Financing/small business loans
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Community Based Economic Development (CBED)

The CBED program of loans, grants and technical assistance helps small businesses to develop viable, sustainable ventures that serve local needs and are compatible with the vision, character and cultural values of their communities.

The CBED loan program supports a broad range of small businesses. CBED loans especially focus on businesses involved in Manufacturing, Wholesaling and Value-added Agricultural Production. Loans should result in an economic development outcome, e.g., new jobs, services, increase in business for local suppliers (product inputs), etc.



CBED Loan Program

- Loans usually range from \$50,000 to \$125,000.
- Interest rates range from 3 -6% with up to a 10-year term.
- Co-lending participation loan arrangements with other lending organizations.
- Loan can be used for 1) working capital; 2) construction or improvement of facilities; 3) purchase of equipment; 4) payment of production and marketing expenses.
- One (1) turn-down from a commercial financial institution.

HI-CAP Collateral Support Program

- **Objective:** Assist small businesses obtain funds to start, enhance or grow their operations, which in turn will retain or create jobs, generate state tax revenue and generate an economic multiplier impact for the State.
- **How:** Provides a credit enhancement to help reduce the Participating Lender's credit risk, in the form of cash collateral to Participating Lenders, to increase access to capital for eligible small businesses and nonprofit organizations.
- **Why:** Potential to support a wide assortment and large number of businesses and industries statewide.
- SSBCI Funds Allocated: \$21,000,000

Eligibility Requirements

- Business must be headquartered in Hawaii
- Borrower must have no more than 750 employees, including full-time, part-time, or obtained from a temporary employee agency.
- Maximum loan amount not to exceed \$20 million, with a loan term of 10 years or less
- Cash collateral provided of no more than 20% of the loan amount or \$1 million, whichever is less
- Minority, Women, or Veteran-owned or controlled business enterprises are encouraged to apply.

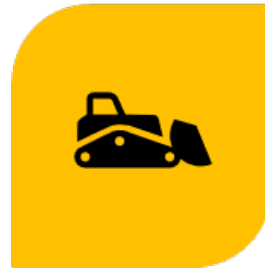

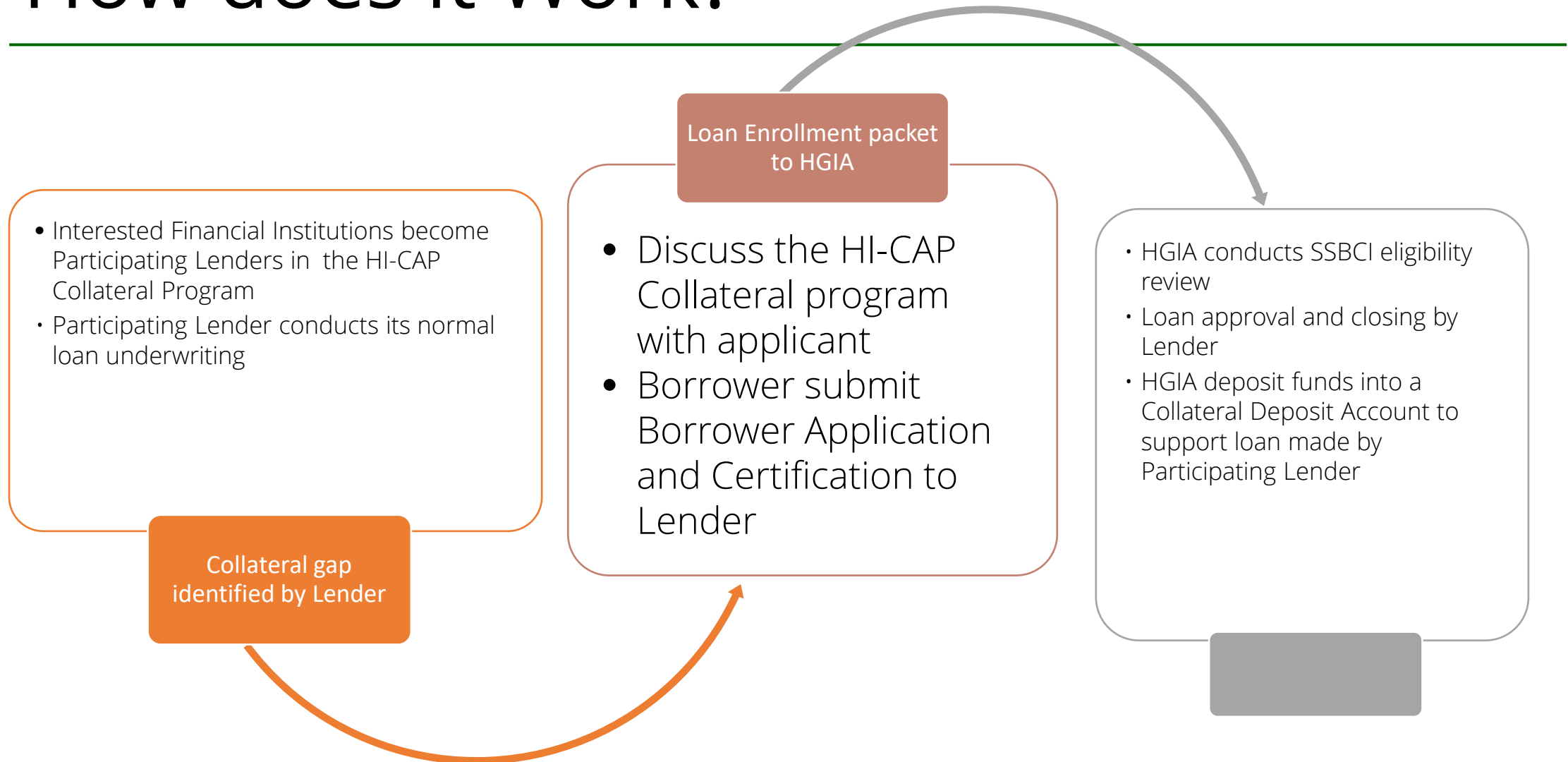

How does it Work?



HI-CAP Loans Program

- **Objective:** Provide below market loan capital to kick-start strategic initiatives or industries.
- **How:** Financing may be in the form of a direct loan, a participation loan or a subordinate loan (similar to HGIA's GEMS financing program)
- SSBCI Funds Allocated: \$20,500,000

High Level Overview

- Co-lend with Social Impact Funds, Banks and Private Lenders
- Finance “catalytic” projects and initiatives that will help advance the state’s goals, which may include:
 - Kick-start social impact lending in Hawaii
 - Community solar projects, etc.

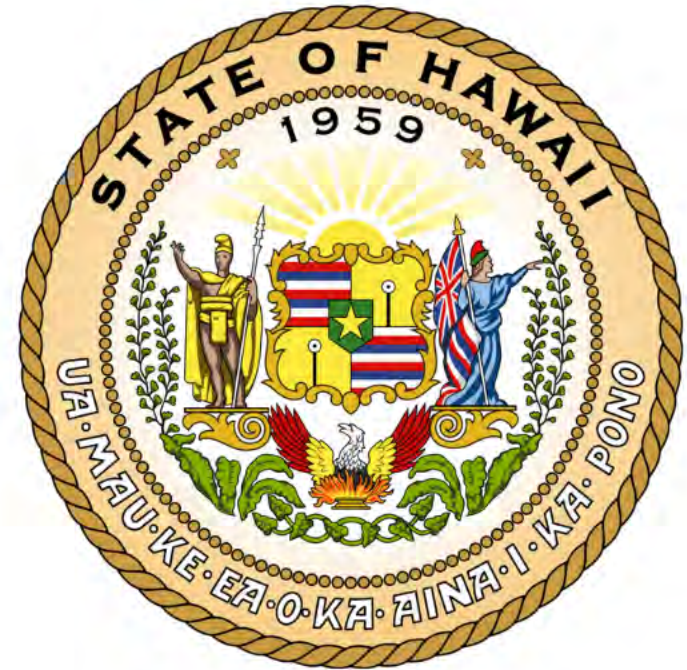
MANUFACTURING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (MAP)

- \$1M funding for State FY23
(JUL '22 - JUN '23)
- Minimum grant \$1,500
- Maximum grant \$100K
- One grant award per
company per year



MANUFACTURING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (MAP)

- Reimbursement award
- Up to 20% of cost for qualified manufacturing expenses
- Purchased (final payment) on or after July 1, 2020

TIPS FOR APPLICATION

- **IMPORTANT** - Manufacturing activities that result in economic and employment growth in Hawaii
- **REMEMBER** - Review committee determines distribution of funds
- **EXPECTATION** - Submitting an application does not guarantee an award



Certificate of Vendor Compliance (HCE)

- Proof of compliance:
 - Hawaii Revised Statutes
 - Hawaii Administrative Rules
- **Compliant** = eligible for State funding
- **Not compliant?**
 - Contact the respective department for assistance (DOTAX, IRS, DCCA, DLIR)

Hawaii Compliance Express (HCE)

Must be complaint at time of application and remain complaint to receive State funds



What is Hawaii Compliance Express?

Hawaii Compliance Express (HCE) is an electronic system that provides vendors, contractors and service providers doing business with state or county agencies to quickly and easily document that they are compliant with applicable laws. HCE expedites your ability to furnish proof of compliance with the requirements of [103D-310\(c\)](#), [HRS](#).

This single certificate eliminates the need to obtain individual copies of clearances with the following agencies:

- Internal Revenue Service (IRS) - Form 8821
- Department of Labor & Industrial Relations (DLIR) - Form LIR27
- Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA) - Form COGS
- Department of Taxation (DOTAX) - Form A-6

Under Hawaii law, you must provide proof of compliance in order to receive a contract worth \$2,500 or more with state and county government entities in Hawaii.

HAWAII SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH PROGRAM (HSBIR)





- One of the largest sources of seed capital in the United States
- Over 4 billion set aside annually
- Not a loan - no payback
- Non-dilutive funding
- Supports R&D and financing of cutting-edge technologies

Participating Government Agencies



HAWAII SBIR (HSBIR) MATCHING GRANT

- Up to 50% of Federal Phase I, II, and III awards
- Helps Hawaii companies compete
- Flexible expenses
- Technical and business assistance



HSBIR Phase 0

- Phase 0 funding up to \$3,000
- Only first time Phase I applicants are eligible
- Reimbursement for grant review assistance
- Proof of submission, invoice

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What is HiSTEP?



Funded in part through a Grant with the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), the Hawaii State Trade Expansion Program, known as HiSTEP, is a comprehensive program designed to assist Hawaii small businesses with their export development.



HiSTEP Partners



Success Metrics for HiSTEP



- Expanded exports and revenue from exports of Hawaii produced goods and services;
- A larger overall number and a larger percentage of Hawaii-based companies that are active in global markets;
- Penetration of new markets for Hawaii produced goods and services.

Eligibility for HiSTEP



Companies wishing to participate in any of the HiSTEP activities must meet at least the following requirements:

1. Federal definition of an 'eligible small business concern.'
2. Certify that the company is not barred from receiving federal funds.
3. Be registered in good standing with the State Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' Business Registration Division.
4. Have a current general excise tax license with the State Department of Taxation.

Program Components



The Hawaii State Trade Expansion Program (HiSTEP) is an export development program comprised of three integrated components:

- 1) HiSTEP – Export Readiness Program (HiSTEP-ERP): A series of training programs and one-on-one business advising services.
- 2) HiSTEP – Market Entry and Expansion Activities: Participation in Hawai‘i Pavilions at major international trade and consumer shows; sales and promotions on e-commerce platforms.
- 3) HiSTEP – Company Assistance (HiSTEP-CA): Direct financial assistance for export market development costs.

HiSTEP – Export Readiness Program (HiSTEP-ERP)



A foundation program that involves a series of export webinars/seminars and one-on-one business advising that prepare Hawaii companies to begin or expand their export market plans.

- Sessions cover general background as well as country- and issue-specific topics.
- One-on-one business advising is offered through the HiSTEP Partners.
- At program conclusion, companies have the tools to develop or revise their go-to-market strategy and export plan.
- Monthly training sessions are scheduled monthly from December through September. Check the HiSTEP website (<https://invest.Hawai'i.gov/exporting/histep/>) for specific topics and dates, and to register to attend.

HiSTEP – Market Entry and Expansion Activities

Trade and Consumer Shows



Trade Shows - DBEDT and the Hawaii Department of Agriculture organize groups of Hawaii companies to participate in major international trade shows in a Hawaii pavilion. Majority of the trade show costs are subsidized by HiSTEP. Companies pay a small participation fee and are responsible for their own travel expenses, shipping, and meeting product import requirements.

Consumer Shows – HiSTEP supports consumer shows as a way to test products in foreign markets directly to consumers. One example is the Hankyu Hawaii Fair Department Store event in Osaka, Japan that attracts 150,000-200,000 consumers during a six-day-long promotion of Hawaii products and lifestyle.

HiSTEP – Market Entry and Expansion Activities

E-Commerce Platforms



Hawaii companies are increasing the use of digital platforms to sell their products and services worldwide, helping to attract and grow international customers. HiSTEP offers these digital platforms aimed at Japanese consumers:

- Makuake - Makuake.com, Japan's leading pre-sales e-commerce platform, will give Hawaii small businesses access to Japanese high-end consumers to sell and promote Made In Hawaii products and help strengthen their Direct-To-Consumer (DTC) capabilities.
- Hankyu Hawaii Life - Extending the success of the annual Hawaii Fair, Hankyu created a new online channel, #Hawaii Life, reaching consumer fans of the Hawaii lifestyle and encouraging those fans to purchase Made In Hawaii products online.

HiSTEP – Company Assistance (HiSTEP-CA)



- Assists individual Hawaii companies with export market development costs.
- Two categories: New To Export (NTE) and Market Expansion (ME)
- NTE companies can request a maximum of \$5,000.
- ME companies can request a maximum of \$15,000. ME companies must also have at least \$200,000 in revenue to apply.
- A Request for Proposal (RFP) will be issued in early November for companies to apply for funds. Deadline is early January of the following year. Anticipate awards made by end of January.
- Funds awarded are paid on a reimbursement basis.

Enterprise Zones Partnership Program (EZ)



The EZ Program offers State & County tax and other benefits to companies in exchange for job preservation and job creation in economically-challenged areas of the State.

Business must meet eligibility requirements to enroll in the program. Most participants are in Manufacturing, Wholesaling and Agricultural Production. Benefits can be for up to seven years.



Eligible Business Activities

- ✓ Agricultural production or processing
- ✓ Manufacturing (wholesaling)
- ✓ Wholesaling/Distribution
- ✓ Biotechnology research, development, production, or sales
- ✓ Aviation or maritime repair or maintenance
- ✓ Telecommunications switching and delivery systems
- ✓ Information technology design and production
- ✓ Medical research, clinical trials, and telemedicine
- ✓ For-profit training programs in international business management or environmental remediation
- ✓ Repair or maintenance of assistive technology equipment
- ✓ Certain types of call centers
- ✓ Wind energy producers



State Benefits

- ✓ 100% exemption from the General Excise Tax (GET) and Use Tax every year. The GET exemption applies only to gross revenues from EZ eligible business categories within an EZ.
- ✓ An 80% reduction of state income tax the first year. (This reduction goes down 10% each year for six more years.)
- ✓ An additional income tax reduction equal to 80% of annual Unemployment Insurance premiums the first year. (This reduction goes down 10% each year for six more years.)
