BACKGROUND

The CPAC is responsible for setting cultural policy direction for the Pacific region for consideration and endorsement by the Pacific Ministers for Culture.
- The main objectives of the 29th Meeting of the Council of Pacific is to:
 - Consider the draft Monitoring and Evaluation Framework for the Regional Culture Strategy Phase 2;
 - Discuss the progress report on the Regional Culture Strategy and way forward post 2020;
 - c. Discuss biosecurity, health and travel matters pertaining to FestPAC;
 - d. Programme of events and any preparations required ahead of the FestPAC in 2019; and
 - e. Conduct a site inspection of the accommodation and venues for the 13th FestPAC.
